Natural Hazard Preparedness Checklist for Businesses

Develop a business continuity plan outlining operations maintenance procedures during and after a disaster. Ensure the plan includes roles and responsibilities, communication strategies, and recovery steps. Here is a check list to help you get started:

RISK Assessment and Planning	
	Identify potential natural hazards affecting Puerto Rico. Assess risks and vulnerabilities specific to your business location. Develop a business continuity plan with roles, responsibilities, and recovery procedures.
Data and Asset Protection	
	Backup critical data regularly and store off-site. Secure physical assets with storm shutters and reinforced structures. Implement data encryption and access controls.
Communication and Training	
	Establish an emergency communication plan with multiple contact methods.
	Conduct regular training on evacuation procedures and emergency protocols.
	Ensure employees understand their roles during emergencies.
Emergency Supplies and Equipment	
	Prepare emergency kits with essentials like first aid, water, and food. Maintain backup power sources (generators) and essential equipment. Install surge protectors and UPS for critical systems.
